John Bryant, the South Central born, Compton, California and South Central reared, self-taught and self-made founder, chairman and CEO of Operation HOPE, Inc., a national non-profit movement focused on financial literacy, economic empowerment and poverty eradication in America.

Founded America's first non-profit social investment banking organization following the worst urban riot in U.S. History ND Brought 150 banks and 35 insurance companies and their CEOs together to fight poverty in America's inner cities

Hosted former President William Jefferson Clinton in Harlem, New York, and President George W. Bush in South Central Los Angeles, in the same week of April of 2002, announcing partnerships to work with both, and founded the nation's first national Inner City Economic Summit, featuring then U.S. Vice President Albert Gore, Jr. in 2000, in South Central Los Angeles

Took U.S. Federal Reserve Chairman Alan Greenspan into an inner city Washington, D.C. classroom in June 2003, to co-teach a class on financial literacy to African-American 8th graders at John Phillip Sousa Middle School; the first school to be integrated during the civil rights movement

Took U.S. Senator Rick Santorum, U.S. Congressman Cummings, FDIC Chairman Donald Powell, nine of the twelve Federal Reserve Bank presidents, superstar Tyrese, and a host of other government and private-sector leaders into inner city classrooms across America to teach financial literacy to youth

President George W. Bush calls Bryant a "social entrepreneur in America" - John has led the charge for financial literacy as a national priority in America, encouraging President Bush to establish the Federal Financial Literacy and Education Commission

Built innovative bank branches, called HOPE Centers, in some of America's most challenging neighborhoods, and then sold them all to banks – making Operation HOPE, Inc. the first non profit in history to do so; reinvesting the proceeds back into community financial literacy education programs

Recruited more than 1,500 HOPE Corps banker teachers to volunteer for Banking on Our Future, an initiative that has educated more than 125,000 urban youth in financial literacy without a dime of public subsidy?

Realized the 21st century anomaly of an "economic disaster" following 9/11, created HOPE Coalition America, which is now recognized by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security and Secretary Tom Ridge as "America's economic Red Cross, and the nation's emergency economic volunteer response program

U.S. Homeland Security Under Secretary and FEMA Director Michael Brown called Bryant "the leading expert and force for promoting financial literacy in America today." John is also an expert advisor to the U.S. Department of Homeland Security
